ORDER

FORMAL CASE NO. 1130, IN THE MATTER OF THE INVESTIGATION INTO MODERNIZING THE ENERGY DELIVERY SYSTEM FOR INCREASED SUSTAINABILITY,

FORMAL CASE NO. 1155, IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION OF THE POTOMAC ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY FOR APPROVAL OF ITS TRANSPORTATION ELECTRIFICATION PROGRAM, and

ELECTRIC TARIFF 2022-05, IN THE MATTER OF THE POTOMAC ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY'S MULTI-DWELLING UNIT PLUG-IN-VEHICLE TARIFF RATE, P.S.C.-D.C. No. 1, Order No. 21968

I. INTRODUCTION

1. By this Order, the Public Service Commission of the District of Columbia (“Commission”) grants the Potomac Electric Power Company’s (“Pepco” or “Company”) Motion to Extend the Implementation Date for Schedule Multi-Dwelling Unit Service – Plug-In Vehicle Charging (“Schedule MDU-PIV”).¹ The new implementation date for Pepco’s Schedule MDU-PIV shall be June 1, 2024.

II. BACKGROUND

2. By Order No. 21907, the Commission approved Pepco’s proposed Schedule MDU-PIV with modification and directed Pepco to make a compliance filing.² On October 13, 2023, Pepco filed the compliance tariff requesting until March 1, 2024, to complete the work required to implement Schedule MDU-PIV.³ On February 21, 2024, Pepco filed a Motion to extend the implementation date of the Company’s Schedule MDU-PIV to June 1, 2024.⁴

III. DISCUSSION

3. In the Motion, Pepco requests an extension until June 1, 2024, to implement Schedule MDU-PIV.⁵ Pepco submits that the Company needs more time to conduct testing of the rate related to meter programming, which includes managing system interfaces between SAP and Itron Enterprise Edition and design items.⁶ Pepco contends that good cause exists for the extension and no persons will be prejudiced since, given the metering requirements, the additional time will ensure that customers who apply for service under this rate schedule are billed properly.⁷

IV. DECISION

4. The Commission has broad authority in managing its docket. Generally, the Commission will grant a request of this nature if good cause is shown.⁸ In this instance, Pepco has presented good cause for an extension since the additional time will facilitate testing of the rate related to metering programming to ensure that customers applying for the tariff will be billed properly.⁹ Since there is no opposition to the Motion, the Commission believes no person would be prejudiced by the granting of the Motion. Accordingly, the Commission grants Pepco's Motion and extends the implementation date to June 1, 2024.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

5. The Potomac Electric Power Company's Motion to Extend the Implementation Date for Schedule Multi-Dwelling Unit Service – Plug-In Vehicle Charging is **GRANTED**;

6. The Potomac Electric Power Company's Schedule Multi-Dwelling Unit Service – Plug-In Vehicle Charging is effective June 1, 2024, unless otherwise ordered by the Commission.
