

FC1050 Quarterly Compliance Report for Pepco



I. Introduction

Pursuant to Public Service Commission of the District of Columbia ("Commission") Order No. 18575 issued on October 17, 2016, Potomac Electric Power Company ("Pepco" or "the Company") submits its Quarterly Interconnection Report for the second quarter of 2024 ("Q2 2024 Report").

II. Background

On February 13, 2009, the Commission promulgated the District of Columbia Small Generator Interconnection Rules ("DCSGIR") setting forth the procedures and standards for customers with on-site generation to interconnect with Pepco's electric distribution system. The DCSGIR requires Pepco, among other things, to maintain and track the Company's progress in implementing interconnections in the District of Columbia.

On October 17, 2016, the Commission issued Order No. 18575 directing Pepco to make certain modifications to its Interconnection Report beginning with its January 1, 2018 report and to file quarterly reports providing certain information regarding the number of incomplete applications and the number of applications for which the approval deadlines have been missed beginning with the quarter ending September 30, 2016.

On July 2, 2019, the Commission issued Order No. 19969 directing Pepco to modify its Quarterly Interconnection Reports beginning with its July 30, 2019, report providing certain information regarding the amount of solar energy from systems meeting the requirement of D.C. Code § 34-1432(e)(1), also now included in 15 D.C.M.R. Section 4008.5(a), for which interconnection requests have been submitted in the previous six (6) months.

III. Q2 2024 Quarterly Report

A. Information Require ed by Commission Order No. 18575

Commission Order No. 18575 requires Pepco to submit to the Commission, within 30 days after the close of each quarter, a report detailing the following: (1) the number of applications for which the approval deadlines have been missed and (2) a report on the number of incomplete applications received.

In compliance with Commission Order No. 18575, the Company reports the number of applications for which the approval deadlines were missed:

1. Timeliness of Approval Deadlines

Timeliness of Review for Completeness

During the quarter ending June 30, 2024, Pepco received 1,036 interconnection requests, a 2.5% increase over the same period last year and completed 95.94% of the initial reviews for completion within the required timeframe. Attachment A provides detail regarding the approval deadlines for the quarter ending June 30, 2024.

Timeliness of Approval to Install

During the quarter ending June 30, 2024, Pepco issued 941 approvals to install and completed 90. 62% (91.08% excluding CREF) of the approvals to install within the required timeframe.

We reviewed seven CREF applications and five failed to meet the regulatory timeline. This resulted in 71.4% of the applications failing to meet Community Renewable Energy Facility (CREF) approval deadlines. Attachment A provides detail regarding the approval deadlines for the quarter ending June 30, 2024.

Timeliness of Authorization to Operate

During the quarter ending June 30, 2024, Pepco issued 568 Level 1 applications Authorizations to Operate ("ATO") and completed 96.48% of the ATOs within the required timeframe.

In compliance with Commission Order No. 18575 the Company reports the number of applications deemed incomplete:

2. Interconnection Requests Deemed Incomplete

During the quarter ending June 30, 2024, Pepco received and reviewed 1,036¹ interconnection requests, of which 254 (or 25%) were deemed incomplete during the completeness review process and returned to the customer and contractor for resubmittal. There were 198 applications resubmitted and are in various stages of the review process. Attachment B provides detail regarding applications deemed incomplete during the quarter ending June 30, 2024.

The top three reasons applications were deemed incomplete during the second quarter of 2024 are as follows: discrepancy system values (101), missing documentation (39), missing usage calculator (27).

B. Information Required by Commission Order 19969

Commission Order No. 19969 requires Pepco to include, beginning no later than July 30, 2019, the total amount of solar energy from solar energy systems meeting the requirements of D.C. Code § 34-1432(e)(1) for which interconnection requests have been submitted in the previous six (6) months in its Quarterly Interconnection Report filed in accordance with Order No. 18575.²

In compliance with Commission Order No. 19969 the Company reports the number and aggregate capacity of interconnection request received in the previous three months:

During the first quarter of 2024, Pepco has received 1,036³ interconnection requests with

an aggregate nameplate capacity of 14.14 MW. These interconnection requests received, and the aggregated nameplate capacity associated with these interconnection requests supplement the data provided in Pepco's last Quarterly report, which was submitted on April 30th, 2024.
