**ORDER UNDER DELEGATED AUTHORITY**

**July 18, 2025**

**FORMAL CASE NO. EA2022-06, IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION OF  
BROOKFIELD RENEWABLE ENERGY MARKETING US, LLC TO SURRENDER ITS  
ELECTRICITY SUPPLIER LICENSE IN THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, Order No.  
22466**

**I. INTRODUCTION**

1. By this Order,<sup>1</sup> the Public Service Commission of the District of Columbia (“Commission”) grants the request of Brookfield Renewable Energy Marketing US, LLC (“BREMUS” or “Applicant”) to surrender its electricity supplier license. Cancellation of the Applicant’s electricity supplier license shall become effective upon the issuance of this Order.

**II. BACKGROUND**

2. On October 20, 2022, the Commission granted BREMUS a license to operate as an electricity supplier in the District of Columbia (“District”) in Order No. 21545.<sup>2</sup> On July 3, 2025, BREMUS filed an Application with the Commission to surrender its electricity supplier license.<sup>3</sup> BREMUS was approved to operate as a marketer of electricity services in the District, but it conducts no business in the District and no longer requires its supplier license.<sup>4</sup> Consequently, BREMUS requests to surrender its electricity supplier license.<sup>5</sup>

### III. DISCUSSION

3. According to 15 DCMR § 4602.10 (a)(1), a licensed electricity supplier wishing to cease providing services in the District is required to provide written notice to the Commission of the licensee's intention to cease providing electricity service to its customers and inform its customers of the choice to revert to the default service provider or another electricity supplier. Section 4602.10 (a)(2) also requires that the surrendering licensee provide to the Commission an example or copy of the notice it provided to its customers and, upon the Commission's receipt of such notice, may order the licensee to provide such further notice to its customers or the public as the Commission deems necessary, and/or take such other action that the Commission considers appropriate.<sup>6</sup>

4. In the instant case, BREMUS's Application provides the required notice to the Commission of its intention to surrender its electricity supplier license.<sup>7</sup> BREMUS also states that the notice requirement to customers is inapplicable inasmuch as it has no customers in the District.<sup>8</sup> In all other respects, BREMUS's Application conforms with Commission requirements for a surrendering licensee. Commission records confirm the Applicant's submission of the case number, order number, and date the Applicant's license was granted.<sup>9</sup> BREMUS avers, and Commission records confirm that the Applicant's most recent survey response indicates no jurisdictional revenue and that it owes no outstanding debt or fees.<sup>10</sup> In addition, the Applicant attests that it has no outstanding consumer complaints.<sup>11</sup> Lastly, the Applicant has submitted an affidavit from an officer of BREMUS attesting to the truth and accuracy of the information submitted.<sup>12</sup>

### IV. DECISION

5. Based upon the preceding information, the Commission grants BREMUS's request to surrender its electricity supplier license granted by Order No. 21545. Cancellation of BREMUS's electricity supplier license shall become effective upon the issuance of this Order. Should BREMUS seek to re-enter the District's electricity market in the future, it shall have to reapply for an electricity supplier license pursuant to Chapter 46 of the Commission's rules.

6. The Application of Brookfield Renewable Energy Marketing US, LLC to surrender its electricity supplier license is **GRANTED**; and

7. Cancellation of Brookfield Renewable Energy Marketing US, LLC's electricity supplier license shall become effective upon the issuance of this Order.
