**THE OFFICE OF THE PEOPLE’S COUNSEL FOR THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA’S  
MOTION FOR ENLARGEMENT OF TIME TO FILE PART TWO OF THE PJM  
CAPACITY AUCTION TASK FORCE RECOMMENDATION REPORT**

Pursuant to Rule 105.8 of the Public Service Commission of the District of Columbia’s (“Commission” or “PSC”) Rules of Practice and Procedure, the Office of the People’s Counsel for the District of Columbia (“OPC”), respectfully requests an enlargement of time to file part two of the PJM Capacity Auction Task Force Recommendation Report in the above-captioned proceeding. Members of the task force, including the Potomac Electric Power Company (Pepco), the Apartment and Office Building Association of Metropolitan Washington (AOBA), and the District of Columbia Government (DCG), and PJM Interconnection, LLC, do not oppose this motion.<sup>1</sup>

In support of this Motion, OPC states the following:

1. On May 21, 2025, the Commission issued Order No. 22425, which established a deadline of July 31, 2025, for the PJM Capacity Auction Task Force to file part one of its recommendation report and October 31, 2025, for filing part two of the recommendation report.<sup>2</sup> Specifically, part one of the report required a discussion on the financial impacts of the July 2024 PJM capacity auction, education and outreach, and other related topics.<sup>3</sup> Part two of the recommendation

report was to discuss “what improvements might be made locally to address the impacts of the capacity auction on District consumers” and ideas “related to long-term issues surrounding the capacity auction.”<sup>4</sup>

2. The task force submitted part one of the report on July 31, 2025. The task force has continued to meet to discuss topics and ideas for part two of the report, meeting approximately once every 30 days. Further time, however, is needed to discuss long-term ideas to help address the capacity auction. This includes additional discussions with PJM on forecasting, the capacity auction, and how best to leverage local strategies such as demand response to reduce the impact of the capacity auction.

3. Accordingly, OPC respectfully requests an extension of no later than January 23, 2025, to file part two of the Task Force Report.

4. This request is made in good faith and not for the purpose of delay. The additional time is necessary to allow for at least two more meetings and adequate time to prepare and draft a joint report. The additional time will not prejudice any party and will allow for a more well-informed report.

**WHEREFORE**, OPC respectfully requests that the Commission grant this Motion and extend the deadline for filing part two of the PJM Capacity Auction Task Force Report to February 5, 2025.
