MEETING MINUTES

Formal Case No. 1176

Lessons Learned Working Group

Date: November 4, 2025

General Matters

The meeting began with confirmation that the Office of People's Counsel (OPC) would take the meeting minutes. Minutes should be circulated within 10 days and filed by November 24th or 25th.

Attending the meeting included Pepco, Apartment and Office Building Association of Metropolitan Washington (AOBA), District of Columbia Government (DCG), and OPC.

Discussions

Parties went over the Metrics Spreadsheet and made sure comments from all the parties were included to the most recent version. It was confirmed that AOBA needed to provide updated comments, which it planned to do shortly.

Parties also went over some edits to the general section of the Lesson Learned Working Group Report (Report), with Pepco and OPC discussing OPC specific edits. The discussion then transitioned to how to address remaining areas within the Report. A general consensus was that three sections that would be addressed by the parties would include comments and recommendations.

AOBA noted that conclusions should also be included and would address answering whether we should continue MYPs in the future, i.e. the next five years. Staff expressed support for this idea.

The discussion then transitioned to scheduling a call on Friday, the 21st to go over the Report further for approximately 30 minutes to touch base. Parties also discussed the Metrics Spreadsheet and consensus and non-consensus items on the spreadsheet. Parties agreed further discussion and meetings may be necessary to properly address the metrics. After further discussion a formal meeting will be convened on November 21, 2025, and a separate call between just the parties will be held prior to the formal meeting.

Parties discussed the format and timing of the Report. AOBA and OPC suggested that parties submit their specific sections to Staff, and Staff would place those sections in the final report. This way parties will not be afforded an opportunity to read and provide rebuttal to comments with the party-specific sections. If parties wish to rebut certain party-specific sections in the final report, they may file separate comments.

Next Steps

The next formal meeting with all Parties and Staff will take place on November 21, 2025. Parties are expected to have a draft of their sections prepared by December 9, 2025.
