Pursuant to Order No. 20203, Paragraph 46 and Attachment A, Pepco provides the following Annual Report on the Capital Grid Project due by August 9 of each year.

Because August 9 is a Sunday, the 2020 report is being filed on the next business day, August 10.

A. Current estimated project cost with an explanation of any significant changes thereto.

Original estimates:

Constructing the rebuilt Harvard Substation - \$180 million.

Constructing the rebuilt Champlain Substation - \$123 million.

Constructing the proposed Mt. Vernon Substation - \$143 million.

Constructing the underground transmission - \$258 million.

Pulling the transmission lines to convert Waterfront Substation 223 from a 138 kV radial to a 230 kV network supply - \$6 million.

Upgrading Waterfront Substation from 138 kV to 230 kV - \$25 million.

230 kV High-Side bus with Phase Shifters - \$115 million

Significant Changes to Estimates and Explanations:

Constructing the rebuilt Harvard Substation - \$191.7 million. The original NOC estimates were prepared early in the design phase in 2016 for the filing for the first NOC in 2017. The current costs are based on final designs and actual contractor bids.

Constructing the rebuilt Champlain Substation - \$151.9 million. This increase is caused by moving the Champlain Substation load transfers into the Champlain Substation budget.

Constructing the proposed Mt. Vernon Substation - \$138.6 million.

Constructing the underground transmission - \$313.3 million. The original NOC estimates were prepared early in the design phase in 2016 for the filing for the first NOC in 2017. The current costs are based on final designs and actual contractor bids.

Pulling the transmission lines to convert Waterfront Substation 223 from a 138 kV radial to a 230 kV network supply - \$20.1 million. The Waterfront 230 kV Conversion project for transmission line work has increased for several reasons. The scope of the project has increase as design work has progressed, most notably the need to build a pumping plant at Waterfront Substation. In addition, the cost of cable installation has increased with the refined design. The cost of the civil work has increased with the refined design, including civil work at the substations to route the feeders to the appropriate termination positions and the civil work (freeze pits) associated to perform the electrical cutovers. Finally, the initial estimate did not include indirect costs, which now have been added to the cost.

Upgrading Waterfront Substation from 138 kV to 230 kV - \$28.3 million. Please see above.

230 kV High-Side bus with Phase Shifters - \$146.9 million. The original NOC estimates were prepared early in the design phase in 2016 for the filing for the first NOC in 2017. The current costs are based on final designs and actual contractor bids.

In addition to the hiring by Capital Grid Project contractors reflected above, Pepco has issued an RFP for a CBE vendor to track compliance on District Hiring, which will be awarded in the third quarter of 2020.

H. Plans for the Downtown Resupply Project.

The Downtown Resupply project will replace aging 34 kV and 69 kV supply feeders to the L Street, F Street, Georgetown, and 22nd Street Substations. This work along with upgrades to the F Street Substation and extension of new 13 kV feeders will accommodate load transfers from I Street Substation as well as increasing sub-transmission supply capacity and providing reliability benefits to the District of Columbia.

Explanation of Significant changes to Project: There have been no significant changes to the Downtown Resupply Project since the April 1, 2020 report, filed as Attachment F to the Annual Consolidated Report.
