**WASHINGTON GAS LIGHT COMPANY'S PLAN TO RETURN TO COMPLIANCE WITH
IT DRUG AND ALCHOL PROGRAM**

Pursuant to the September 17, 2020 Letter of the Public Service Commission of the District of Columbia's ("Commission") Office of Compliance and Enforcement ("OCE"), Washington Gas Light Company ("Washington Gas" or the "Company") provides the foregoing plan it has to Return to Compliance with its Drug and Alcohol Program.

To protect the health and safety of our employees, Washington Gas continues to monitor the COVID-19 situation, and the impact it has on Random Drug & Alcohol Testing. Washington Gas recognizes and adheres to the requirements of social distancing to reduce the risk of potential exposure to COVID-19. To that end, the Company has experienced significant challenges to maintain social distancing and avoid gatherings of 10 or more individuals for our onsite and offsite testing. The Company will continue to work toward meeting the 50% testing level. At minimum, Washington Gas currently expects it will be able to achieve a testing rate of 25% for Q2 through Q4 2020. The approximate testing rates achieved for Q2 and Q3 are 38% and 50%, respectively.

Washington Gas continues to monitor the COVID-19 pandemic but is not reasonably able to predict future conditions of the pandemic that may impact testing. However, the Company has continued efforts to test at the 50% rate and reacts to challenges as they occur to maintain that rate as closely as possible.
