Re: <u>Formal Case No. 1164</u> [Washington Gas - Retroactive Expansion of RES Qualifications]

Dear Ms. Westbrook-Sedgwick:

The Workgroup meetings in Formal Case No. 1164 have been discussing the possibility of expanding the eligibility requirements for a customer's participation in the Washington Gas Light Company's ("Washington Gas" or the "Company") Residential Essential Services ("RES") program on a temporary basis. The Company has been requested to calculate the "estimated": costs that would result from an eligibility expansion. The attached analysis shows different estimated participation rates of newly eligible customers - ranging from 15% to 35%, along with projected cost data. A DOEE submission was made on April 23, 2021 explaining the proposed changes.

Washington Gas would "guesstimate" that a 15% increase in the program enrollment (per DOEE presentation at Workgroup meeting) is the best estimate to use. Based on the 15% enrollment increase, the Company is projecting an additional cost of **\$1.2 million** for the period November 2021 - April 2022 - with all credits at the 100% RES credit level approved in Case No 1162, the Company's last rate case. If the expanded eligibility would allow newly eligible customers to receive credits for current (November 2020 - April 2021) RES period, that would result in an additional cost of this RES credit to be **\$750,000** to the current RES year, based on the November 2020-March 2021 at a 55% RES credit, and April 2021 at 100% based on the Formal Case No. 1162 approved Settlement Agreement.

If the Commission approves the expanded eligibility for the November 2020 through April 2021 period, the Company would make a filing based on that Order to revise its RES surcharge for the remainder of the current RES surcharge period.
