**Advanced Metering Task Force
Quarterly Update Report**

July 20, 2015

On November 24, 2010, the District of Columbia Public Service Commission ("Commission") issued Order No. 16071 in Formal Case No. 1056 directing the Advanced Metering Infrastructure Task Force ("Task Force") to file with the Commission supplemental monthly status update reports covering the progress being made, problems encountered, and to provide a list of outreach activities planned and those that have taken place. In Order No. 16484, issued August 4, 2011, the Commission approved the Proposed Customer Education Plan ("Plan") Campaign I covering AMI meter deployment and installation, with any further refinements to be unanimously agreed upon by Task Force members. The Commission further directed the Task Force to develop a more detailed version of the Plan's Campaign II covering enablement of customer benefits, to be filed by November 1, 2011.

The Task Force submitted the Customer Education Plan Campaign II on November 1, 2011 as directed by the Commission in Order No. 16484. The Campaign II plan is designed to educate customers about the benefits of the smart meters installed by Pepco. Specifically, the Customer Education Plan Campaign II explains how customers will be educated on the increased availability of energy usage data, such as hourly energy use information, and on the activation of AMI meter release capabilities. On March 22, 2012, the Commission issued Order No. 16744 in Formal Case No. 1056 approving the

Customer Education Plan II, and directed the Company to continue with its implementation.

The Task Force includes representatives of the Office of the People's Counsel ("OPC"), the Commission staff ("Staff"), the Sustainable Energy Utility ("SEU"), the District Department of the Environment ("DDOE"), the Potomac Electric Power Company ("Pepco"), AARP DC, The Greene Firm, as well as non-governmental entities representing specific consumer interests, including community-based organizations such as DC Climate Action. The discussion below and the attachment to this document provide the information which the Commission directed the AMI Task Force to include in its monthly status update report.

Since its April 20, 2015 update report, the Task Force has continued to engage in a variety of customer education outreach activities and has planned numerous specific outreach events for the near future. The customer outreach has included public meetings with community groups and participation at community events to increase customer awareness of smart meter technology and of Pepco's deployment of AMI in the District of Columbia. As previously reported, the customer outreach effort has included public events targeting multi-lingual customers, with several of these held in recent months. Pepco's most recent AMI Education Outreach Calendar is included as Attachment A.

At the July 9, 2015 Task Force meeting, Pepco reported that approximately 285,647 meters have been exchanged and 279,084 meters have been activated as of March 31, 2015. As of May 14, 2015, 3,075 hard to access meters remain.

The group discussed the balance of the AMI meters that have not been activated yet for billing. The majority of the non-activated meters require communication

remediation including additional communication equipment installations and further testing of internal programs. On account of Solution One, some customers, such as large commercial accounts and NEM customers, still require further testing of programs before activation can occur. The Company agreed to follow up via email to the group with a more detailed account of the issues affecting these customers.

Prior to the next meeting, the Company will distribute its most recent comprehensive Customer Education Plan for review of the Task Force.

The Task Force has scheduled its next meeting for October 8, 2015. This is the last scheduled meeting for the Task Force.
