Dear Ms. Westbrook-Sedgwick:

Potomac Electric Power Company ("Pepco"), on behalf of the Office of the People's Counsel of the District of Columbia, the Apartment and Office Building of the District of Columbia, the Government of the District of Columbia, DC Climate Action, Baltimore-Washington Construction and Public Employees Laborers' District Council, Maryland DC Virginia Solar Energy Industries Association, DC Consumer Utility Board and Solar United Neighbors DC, the Small Business Utility Advocates, and Tesla, Inc. (collectively, the "Settling Parties"), responds to Paragraph 49(w) of Order No. 19433 ("Order") issued by the Public Service Commission of the District of Columbia ("Commission") on August 9, 2018. In pertinent part, Paragraph 47(w) of the Order directed the Settling Parties to make a joint filing by September 10, 2018 "to update the across-the-board distribution based on the per customer approach" adopted in the Order to take into account additional the Tax Cut and Jobs Act of 2017 ("TCJA") savings from the period between July 1, 2018 and the date that the rates authorized by the Order went into effect, August 13, 2018.

The Settling Parties agree that the additional TCJA savings from the period between July 1, 2018 and August 13, 2018 is \$4.913 million. Consistent with paragraph 9(c) of the Settlement Agreement, the Settling Parties agree that, in lieu of distributing the additional TCJA amount to residential customers, Pepco will apply the additional TCJA amount towards the Customer Base Rate Credit ("CBRC") established in Formal Case No. 1119.¹

In addition, the Settling Parties agree that Pepco will issue commercial customers a one-time bill credit that will be posted to the customers' accounts within 30 days of the

¹ The incremental amount allocated to the residential class to account for the time period July 1, 2018 to August 12, 2018 is \$0.892 million, for a total of \$4.385 that will be added to the CBRC.

Commission approving this filing, or 30 days after no objection is received as stated in Paragraph 47(w) of the Order. The following table shows allocation of credit for each customer class.
